Epiphany - The First Pilgrims Come to Bethlehem

The scene in Matthew 2:1-12 is heavily laden with Eastern mystery trappings. The star that goes ahead and eventually hovers over where the child is located is the light that we all look for in life. It was real to the wise men, and it is real to us as we read the story. The journey that the Magi undertake is a perilous one, and yet they persist and reach their destination. The gifts that they bring have always been seen as symbolic, and Matthew no doubt saw it that way. What are we to make of this story in the twentyfirst century?

What did the three wise men see when they gazed into the eyes of "Destiny's child, eyes like mirrors?" They obviously saw enough, because they knelt before him and offered their gifts. Then they went away, avoiding Herod's spies and any reprisal from Herod against them. According to T.S. Eliot's poem, *The Journey of the Magi*, they went back to their own country and were unsettled there with their own gods because of what they had seen at Bethlehem. Eliot's reading of the situation may be quite right, but like him we can only speculate about it. What we can do is compare the journey of the Magi with our own journey towards Christ. We can think of what gifts we might bring to him. We can think of what gifts we have seen when we have looked into the eyes of Destiny's Child.

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Look for the Christ in every corner of your life and you will find him. Look for the Christ in every step of the journey and you will find him. Look for the Christ at the end of the journey and you will find him looking at you. Bring your gifts to him and bend the knee, and then rise up and get on with your life. We are all pilgrims and sojourners upon earth. The goal of our journey affects how we conduct our life now. We "saw the light" when we were born, and we look for it all of our days. We all have a great deal to offer. My own personal resolve in 2010 is to bring a blessing to as many lives as I can and to end each day with a reflection on what I have done about it. May the "Light of the world" shine on your face and may you find a piece of heaven in this New Year of our Lord.
