## Why do some make it and some do not?

Many fires are raging in New South Wales today and 42+ Celsius temperatures are expected tomorrow in many places. Helicopters loaded with water are dousing flames in inaccessible mountain crannies and stock and property are consumed by the hungry flames racing across flat grasslands. As in such disasters in the Philippines, lives have been lost and the treasures of the years reduced to ashes.

An enigmatic passage in Luke 13:3-4 recalls the crashing of the tower of Siloam in Jerusalem and the 18 deaths that it caused. In a small parish Church a small boy reads a eulogy for his still-young father who has died of a heart attack. Everyone cries. Empty beer cans ("tinnies") are placed on the coffin by his mates as symbols of his life.

Afterwards the young friends of the deceased stand outside the church drinking from beer cans and smoking. No one has listened to the real funeral address. The little boy is patted on head. He has done well, but he carries his heartache away with him for the rest of his life. We all ask questions about why some vanish from our midst and some are saved. Life has no simple answers. But asking the right questions, as Rilke said, may introduce us to clearer traces of the answers.

I am thankful that I work with people who dare to ask the questions that the search for truth demands. Truth is not an abstract matter. It is doused with tears and encased in tribulation, but it surprises us in our moments of happiness with occasional glimpses of clarity. No one should apologise for being happy. It may be revealing something that for a moment is the greatest truth on the planet.

Candidates who agree to his/her nomination will have to sign the nomination form, with the confirmation that he/she will be present for the first Vestry Organizational Meeting on Monday, $28^{\text {th }}$ of January, 2013. Last day for submission of nomination forms will be Jan. 20, 2013.
4. As per Vestry approved guidelines in the holding of Annual Elections for Vestry Members, no proxy voting will be allowed. Instead, advance voting shall be allowed starting from Thursday (Jan. 24) to Saturday (Jan. 26) for those who cannot be in church on Jan. 27. Ballots will be available at the Parish Office.
