Ioyou find it hard sometimes to believe in what we do not see?

I guess it is understandable Thomas wanted to see the Lord with his own eyes. Jesus accommodates this, then encourages a new way of seeing. "Blessed are those who have not seen yet come to believe."

It seems to me the wounds inflicted by power and fear are still evident in the world, but touching them is another matter. Maybe Thomas was more courageous than what we give him credit for. Humanity still bleeds. The good news of Easter is that within our woundedness is a God who shares it, and with words of triumph says "peace be with you, as the Father has sent me, I now send you." Jesus prepares the disciples for his leaving from their eye sight. A new form of the risen Christ was about to be born - the Body of Christ, empowered by the Holy Spirit. With a church named after the Holy Trinity, may we be encouraged also to be sent out with faithful eyesight which enables us to see both beauty and brokenness and to act upon it.
