## The feast of Christ the King.

he last Sunday of our liturgical year speaks to us about Jesus Christ: A King according to the heart of God. Our today's readings illuminate in their own ways the mystery of Jesus' Kingship which is not based on our own understanding of royalty. For us, a king is someone strong, he is a master. He is the leader of a powerful army. He owns land, palaces. In short, we see some-

one privileged and who shows it.

In this manner, we could have expected to receive on this feast, some texts that emphasize the power of Christ. Instead, we have Jesus Christ on the cross, all helpless, subject to mockery and insults. Today, with this gospel, we see the only true king offering himself for all his subjects.

It is he who stands before the door of your heart and who simply asks that you invite him to enter. Here is your King! He is a king who kneels before his subjects to wash their feet. He is a king who for you was born in a manger to show that he came to seek everyone and not only the best, the most beautiful, the most fortunate, but all who seek him in truth.
